

W3 Professorship in Human Geography

The Faculty of Chemistry and Earth Sciences at Heidelberg University is seeking to appoint a professor (W3) in Human Geography (to succeed Professor Dr. Hans Gebhardt) at the earliest opportunity. The position in question is a leading professorship. Its holder will be expected to maintain and enhance the international research profile of the Institute of Geography.

Candidates are expected to have an internationally established record of accomplishments in Human Geography as part of an international scientific research network. A participation in local research activities of Heidelberg University will be appreciated.

The successful candidate will cover the area of Human Geography in research, teaching and academic self-government. Teaching, oral examination and administration will be conducted in German.

Prerequisites for application are a university degree and (in accordance with Article 47, paragraph 2 of the Higher Education Law of the state of Baden-Württemberg) a Habilitation or an equivalent qualification, e.g. a successfully evaluated junior professorship.

Heidelberg University seeks to achieve a higher proportion of women in areas where they have not been adequately represented so far. Women with the requisite qualifications are expressly encouraged to apply. Preference will be given to disabled applicants with equal qualifications and aptitude for the position.

Outstanding individuals with a strong commitment to research and teaching are encouraged to apply and should send, electronically (pdf), a CV, a list of publications, a list of completed and ongoing research projects, a summary of teaching experience, and a statement of research interests and future plans.
